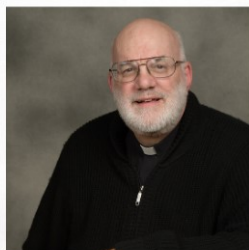

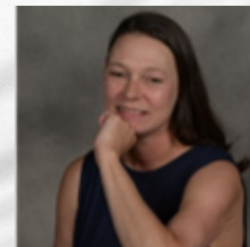

## *Altar Server*

**Contact: Parish Office 419-562-1346**

Assisting the priest during Mass is an important ministry filled by dedicated youth. They are committed to serving God and the parishioners of Holy Trinity. The primary role of the altar server is to assist the priest in the celebration of the liturgy during Mass. Servers carry the cross, and the processional candles, hold the book for the priest when he is not at the altar, carry the incense and censer, present the bread, wine, and water to the priest during the preparation of the gifts, or assist him when he receives the gifts from the people, wash the hands of the priest, assist the priest celebrant and deacon as necessary. If you would like to be an Altar Server, please call the Parish Office.

## *Lector*

The primary role of a lector is to proclaim the Word of God from the Holy Scriptures. Lectors assist the priest by reading the First Reading, Second Reading, and the Prayers of the Faithful during Mass. Not only should lectors be effective communicators comfortable with public speaking, but they should also be conscious of their role in expressing God's Word to the rest of the parish community present at the liturgy. ## *EMHC*

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion assist the priest and deacon in distributing the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ at Mass. This is a very important and serious ministry. EMHCs must be approved, trained, and commissioned. Additionally, Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Communion take communion to Catholics in retirement centers, nursing homes, and private residences. If you are interested in becoming an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, please call the Parish Office.

You are not rushed into making a decision. You are the person who decides at the time right for you. If you decide to proceed, you will be welcomed into the Church at the Easter Vigil service. ## *Parish School of Religion - PSR*

PSR, or Parish School of Religion, is a program dedicated to the children of our parish and Church that teaches them essential elements about Catholicism to help them progress in their faith journey.

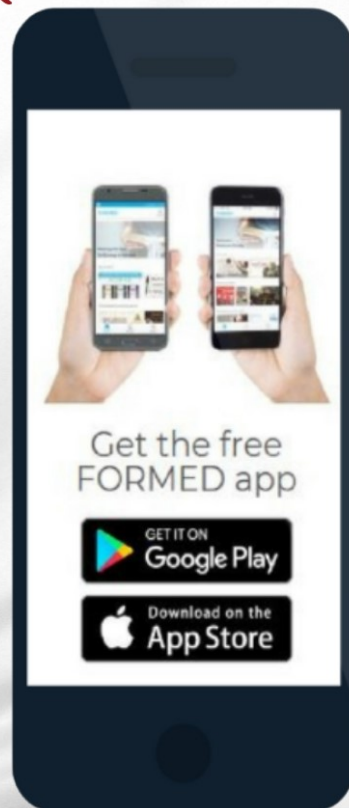
